09:30 – 11:00	Current issues in international criminal justice <p>This panel will examine and comment on the latest controversial decisions by the International Criminal Court in the cases of Bemba, Gbagbo and Al-Bashir, as well as on the situation in Afghanistan. Although on different grounds, all three decisions have been widely criticized by scholars and practitioners alike, thus fuelling the challenging narrative on the Court. The panel will also discuss the opportunities and challenges of the recent establishment of U.N. independent investigative mechanisms such as the IIIM (Syria), IIM (Myanmar) and UNITAD (Iraq). Current issues on classification of armed conflicts

This panel will discuss the most challenging legal criteria for classifying a situation as an armed conflict of either international or non-international character.
